



CURLEW CAMP WALK AND PICNIC

You are invited to join Pat Mills, the Mosman Historical Society's Immediate Past President, on a guided return walk from the eastern end of **Sirius Cove Reserve** (also known as Sirius Park) to Curlew Camp.

The walk commences at **5.30 PM** and concludes about an hour later. The well-graded track is quite short, with most of the time being spent at Curlew Camp itself, where Pat will discuss its main features and history. There are some steps to climb.

On Little Sirius Cove's eastern shore, Curlew Camp existed from 1890 to 1912. Famous Australian artists such as Tom Roberts and Arthur Streeton lived in tents there, painting the beautiful nearby harbour scenery.

A picnic at Sirius Cove Reserve follows the walk. Participants are asked to provide their own food and drinks.

There are plentiful parking spaces adjoining Sirius Cove Reserve.
