The Mosman-Neutral Bay Rifle Club began on 27 March 1915 following calls from Mosman and Neutral Bay residents for a 'Rifle and Training Corps'. More than 240 of its members enlisted in the armed forces and 16 were killed during the First World War. The club continued after the war, enjoying many successes in competitive target shooting. Today it has a formidable reputation both nationally and internationally.

Neil Gibbins has been a Mosman Neutral-Bay Rifle Club member for almost 30 years. An accomplished shooter, he represented New South Wales and Australia on many occasions. He is also involved with the sport's administration.
